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CHAPTER-I

INTRODUCTION

The federating units/territories of Pakistan are not equal in level of economic and social development(s). The fundamental objective(s) of government functionaries at Federal, Provincial and Local level is to provide basic amenities to the people at their doorsteps as far as possible in keeping with the spirit of the mandate of people & law.

2. The fiscal decentralization to the local bodies at the Provincial level of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa is channelized through Provincial Finance Commission (PFC) – a statutory body established under Section 52 of the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Local Government Act, 2013. This institution visualizes its budgetary policies & priorities through its financial Award containing recommendations as to a self-contained fiscal transfer system extending over the whole Province. The main objective of this Award is to offer a formula-based inter-governmental revenue-sharing system featuring transparency, equitability and predictability; so that local governments may find themselves inclined towards bringing about improvement(s) in their performance, service delivery and promotion of general welfare of the people.

3. The big chunk of revenues of the Provincial Government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (90% or more) arises out of the Federal Transfers comprising: Federal tax assignment, straight transfers on account of Oil and Gas Royalty, Excise duty/Development Surcharge on Gas and Net Hydel profit etc.

4. Through its financial Award, the Commission makes vertical & horizontal allocations of resources viz., (a) between the Province & Local governments and (b) the local governments inter se. In this regard first a **Provincial Pool** is determined based on the proceeds of Provincial Consolidated Fund. The **Obligatory expenditure** characterizing universality in its nature is therefore, deducted from the Provincial Pool and a **Divisible Pool** is thus determined. The net proceeds forming part of the Divisible Pool are further divided into **Provincial Allocable Resources** and **Provincial Retained Resources**. The Provincial Allocable resources are earmarked for the local governments whereas; the Provincial Retained resources are maintained by the Provincial Govt.





CHAPTER-II

PROFILE OF PFC AWARDS

So far Eight (08) PFC Awards have been announced. Six Awards thereof (i.e. the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 6th, 7th & 8th one) have been of interim nature while the 4th & 5th awards were for a period of 3 years (i.e. 2005/06 – 2007/08 and 2008/09 – 2010/11). Through these Awards Local Governments have been receiving their due share(s) from the net Divisible Pool. The inter-se distribution of Provincial Allocable Amount (developmental one) under the said interim Awards was made on the basis of following formula:-

1. <i>Population</i>	50%
2. <i>Backwardness (Based on MICS)</i>	25%
3. <i>Lag in Infrastructure</i>	25%

2. For the 4th (3-year Award), the parameters were however, revised in terms of percentage as under:-

1. <i>Population</i>	60%
2. <i>Backwardness (Based on MICS)</i>	20%
3. <i>Lag in Infrastructure</i>	20%

3. In the 5th, 6th, 7th & 8th Awards (i.e 2008/09 - 2010/11, 2016 -17, 2017-18 & 2018-19) the Commission allowed allocation/distribution of funds on basis of the formula mentioned hereinbefore.

4. A brief summary of the PFC Awards indicates that the Provincial Allocable Amount has kept on increasing ever since the introduction of the local government system in 2002 as under:-

CHAPTER-IV

FUNCTIONS OF THE COMMISSION

The **functions** of the Provincial Finance Commission as laid down in Section 53 of the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Local Government Act, 2013 *readwith the proviso to clause(a) and; clause(b) of Section 2* of the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Local Government (Amendment) Act, 2017 (Annexure-II) are as under:

1) The Finance Commission shall make recommendations to the Government on :

a) the amount of grant for local governments out of the proceeds of Provincial Consolidated Fund in a financial year in addition to the grant in lieu of Octroi and Zilla Tax:

Provided that in addition to the establishment charges budgeted for the devolved functions and transfers in lieu of Octroi and Zilla Taxes, the development grant for local governments shall be so determined that it is not less than thirty percent of the total development budget of the province in the respective year;

***Provided further that Government may allocate certain amount from the thirty per cent (30%) grant to a public interest fund to be administered by Government and to be used by public functionaries for the development of local governments; and**

(b) **formula for distribution of the grant, as Government may direct, among local governments in the Province;***





- (c) the amount of special grants for local governments with modalities and conditions to access the facility;
- (d) grants in aid to local governments in need of assistance; and
- (e) matters relating to local government finance.

2) While making recommendations, the Finance Commission shall take into account the principles of fiscal needs, fiscal capacity, fiscal efforts and fiscal performance of local governments.

3) The Finance Commission shall also take into consideration poverty, population, lag in infrastructure and revenue base of local governments as factors while formulating its recommendations.

4) The Finance Commission shall present to the Government annually a report on the analysis of fiscal transfers, the situation of own-source revenue in local governments and the reach and quality of their services and the Government shall cause the report to be laid before the Provincial Assembly.





CHAPTER-V

BASIC PRINCIPLES/METHODOLOGY GOVERNING DISTRIBUTION OF RESOURCES

A. PROVINCIAL POOL

The Provincial Pool consists of the following items of revenue:

- i) Revenue Assignment from Federal Divisible Pool
- ii) 1% of Divisible Pool for War on Terror.
- iii) Straight Transfers
- iv) Provincial Own Receipts (Tax & Non Tax)
- v) Net Profit from Hydel Power (uncapping of NHP)
- vi) Arrears of Net Hydel Profit

Details of Revenue Budget are exhibited at **Annexure-III**.

B. OBLIGATORY EXPENDITURE

Obligatory expenditure, being of common and vital national interest to both Provincial and Local Governments, is subtracted from the Provincial Pool with a view to determining the Divisible Pool. Currently, it comprises the following items:

- (i) Debt Servicing
- (ii) Pension
- (iii) Subsidy on Wheat
- (iv) Contribution to GP Funds and Pension Funds.
- (v) Hydel Development Fund
- (vi) Charged Expenditure (Governor's House/Secretariat, Provincial Assembly, High Courts and Ehtisab Commission)
- (vii) Law and Order (Home, Police & Civil Defence)

C. DIVISIBLE POOL

The Balance Amount accruing as a result of subtraction of obligatory expenditure from the Provincial Pool constitutes the Divisible Pool.





D. SHARING PROCEEDS

The Divisible Pool is shared/distributed between the Provincial and Local Governments as “**Provincial Retained Amount**” and “**Provincial Allocable Amount**” at the ratio of **40:60** respectively. The Provincial Allocable Amount is subjected to fiscal needs, fiscal capacity, fiscal efforts & fiscal performance.

E. DISTRIBUTION OF PROVINCIAL ALLOCABLE AMOUNT

The Provincial Allocable Amount is distributed to meet the following items of expenditure:-

- i) *Salary*
- ii) *Non-Salary*
- iii) *Development*
- i) *Grant to Local Councils*

F. FORMULA FOR INTER-SE DISTRIBUTION OF DISTRICT DEVELOPMENT FUNDS

Under Section 2 (b) of the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Local Government (Amendment) Act, 2017 the Provincial Government is required to formally devise a formula in this regard. Until such time, the inter se distribution of District Development Share out of the Provincial Allocable Amount shall be made on basis of the following formula to cater for development needs of the local governments:

i)	<i>Population</i>	60%
ii)	<i>Poverty</i>	20%
iii)	<i>Lag in Infrastructure</i>	20%





CHAPTER- VI

PFC RECOMMENDATIONS

Having taken into consideration the principles/ methodology expressed in Section(s) 53(1)(a), (b) and (d), (2) and (3) of LGA, 2013 readwith Section 2 of the KP, LG(Amendment) Act,2017 and making due deliberations, the Provincial Finance Commission in its 11th meeting held on 21-05-2019 made the following recommendations with regard to distribution of Provincial Allocable Amount (*Minutes at Annexure-IV*):

1) Salary

The Commission has recommended 5% annual incremental increase over the revised estimates 2018-19 with a block provision of Rs. 9,500.000 million to allow for a fiscal space in the budget.

2) Non-Salary

a) *In this regard the Commission proposed 10% increase over the current year's allocations (2018-19), with a block provision of Rs. 7,620.930 million in respect of the following items:*

b) The commission however expanded the scope of conditional Grant for emergency medicines in BHUs (Rs. 1000.000 million mentioned at Sr.No.3 of the above table) to all the devolved health entities/hospitals under the administrative control of DHOs concerned.

3) **Grant To Local Councils**

The Grant to Local Councils includes Grant to TMAs, Cantonment Boards and District Council/V.Cs & N.Cs.

i) **Grant to TMAs**

a) *05% increase over current year (2018-19) grant to TMAs.*

b) *Block allocation/provision of Rs.500.00 million for financially weak/newly created TMAs on need basis. The release(s) to this effect shall however, be subject to the mechanism to be evolved by the Local Government Department.*

ii) **Grant to Cantonment Boards**

a) *The historic share/collection of grant/share of Cantonment Boards (CBs) having share arrangements with adjacent TMAs shall continue to be transferred as usual.*

b) *The commission however, recommended 05% increase over the current year's allocations to CBs.*

iii) **Grant to District Councils/V.Cs & N.Cs**

a) *The Commission recommended 05% increase over the current year's allocations (2018-19) under Grant to District Councils/VCs/NCs.*

b) *District Government shall retain 20% share of the Grant to meet salary/operational expenses of the staff of District Council Secretariat and charge(s) on account of honoraria, allowances and other perks and privileges of the elected official(s) of the District Council while the remaining 80% thereof shall be transferable to VCs/NCs for meeting out their requirements on account of honoraria, allowances and perks & privileges of the elected officials as well as other operational expenses.*





4) **District Development Share**

- i) *As per Section 53 of LGA, 2013 the Development Grant for Local Govt. shall not be less than 30% of the total development budget of the province in respective year.*
- ii) *Similarly, according to the proviso to Clause (a) of Section-2 of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Local Government (Amendment) Act, 2017 the Government may allocate certain amount from the thirty per cent (30%) grant to a public interest fund to be administered by Government and to be used by public functionaries for the development of local governments.*
- iii) *The total Provincial ADP is Rs.154,000.000 Million out of which the Provincial Government has allocated a sum of Rs 46,000.000 Million as District ADP. Out of this, 3% share amounting to Rs. 1,380.000 Million will be allocated under the Public Interest Fund. The said Fund will however, be transferred according to the mechanism/formula devised and notified by the Local Government Department. Remaining amount of Rs. 44,620.000 Million will nevertheless, be transferred to local governments as District Development Grant to meet their developmental requirements in the next financial year 2019-20 in light of the following decision of the Ex-Chief Minister Khyber Pakhtunkhwa taken in the meeting held on 08-06-2015:*

“Minimum of Rs. 2.000 million shall be provided to each village and neighborhood Councils having a population of 2000 village Councils and neighborhood Councils having more than 2000 population shall be provided additional funds of Rs. 0.50 million for every 1000 population exceeding the minimum threshold.

Remaining balance funds for local governments (after meeting the village and neighborhood Council shares) shall be distributed between the District Government and TMAs with the ratio of 50:50 each.”





iv) The tier-wise breakup of District Development Fund is as under:

5) Provision for newly created District of Upper Chitral.

- a) 5% increase over the revised size of Salary component.
- b) 10% increase over Non-Salary.
- c) 05% increase over Grant to Local Councils.
- d) Additional allocation/provision of Rs. 20.000 million under Non-Salary component.

6) Provision for leave encashment in lieu of LPR under Non-Salary for the next financial year 2019-20.

Upon creation of the object code “leave encashment in lieu of LPR” under non-salary component by CGA, the commission was pleased to recommend in this regard **Rs. 2811.000 million** worked out on the basis of actual of last financial year.

7) Provisions for the districts of Newly Merged Areas (NMAs) for financial year 2019-20.

- a) 5% increase over the revised size of Salary component in r/o devolved functions/departments of NMAs.
- b) 10% increase over Non-Salary of devolved departments of NMAs.
- c) Block Allocations of **Rs. 4000.000 million** as District Development Fund for NMAs under development component.





8) Provisions for the Establishment of 25 Nos. of TMAs in New Merged Areas (Erstwhile FATA) 2019-20

The commission in line with the approval of Chief Minister on the summary of Local Govt. Department recommended Rs. 542.617 million as one time operational grant for the establishment of 25 TMAs in NMAs during the next financial year 2019-20.

9) Provision for operational grant for the establishment of District and village/neighborhood councils in Newly Merged Areas (NMA) for 2019-20.

- a) *In this regard, the commission recommended Rs. 175.000 million (Rs. 25.000 million each per unit/district) on the analogy of corresponding size of sums allocated for areas of settled districts like Battagram, Upper Dir, Tank & Shangla etc.*
- b) *The commission nevertheless, recommended creation of required number of posts in the VCs/NCs etc to be established in the wake of ongoing changes in Local Govt. System without providing any cash cover therefor at least for the time being.*

10) Any other item with permission of the Chair.

The commission during the course of deliberations urged the need for thorough discussion on issues like improving distribution mechanism/formula, taxation issues with cantonment boards & rationalization of conditional grant/block allocation under Education & Health Sectors etc. in the future meetings.

11) Term of the Award

For want of the required Formula under the provisions of the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Local Government (Amendment) Act, 2017 and collection of data necessitated thereby, the Commission has recommended the present PFC Award on the basis of previous formula (2008-09 to 2010-11) for a term of one year viz., 2019-20.





12) **Other Recommendations**

In case of at-source deduction/adjustment from the revenue assignment of the Province by the Federal Government/ PESCO on account of outstanding electricity charges against a District Government or Tehsil/Town Administration, proportionate at-source deductions will be made from the share(s) of the respective District/Tehsil/Town Council. Further, in case any District Govt./Tehsil or Town Administration fails to ensure timely payment of monthly electricity dues to PESCO, Finance Department shall make such payment direct to PESCO and adjust the spent amount against the concerned District Government's Accounts. Likewise, such adjustments shall also be made against the Accounts of Tehsil/ Town Administration as the case may be.







Further to amend the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa
Local Government Act, 2013

WHEREAS it is expedient further to amend the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Local Government Act, 2013 (Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Act No. XXVIII of 2013), for the purposes hereinafter appearing;

It is hereby enacted as follow:

1. **Short title and commencement.**—(1) This Act may be called the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Local Government (Amendment) Act, 2017.
(2) It shall come into force at once.
2. **Amendment of section 53 of the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Act No. XXVIII of 2013.**—In the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Local Government Act, 2013 (Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Act No. XXVIII of 2013), in section 53.—
 - (a) in clause (a), the semi-colon, appearing at the end shall be replaced by a colon and thereafter the following new proviso shall be added, namely:

“Provided further that Government may allocate certain amount from the thirty per cent (30%) grant to a public interest fund to be administered by Government and to be used by public functionaries for the development of local governments; and
 - (b) for clause (b), the following shall be substituted, namely:

“(b) formula for distribution of the grant, as Government may direct, among local governments in the Province;”.

**MINUTES OF THE 11TH MEETING OF PROVINCIAL FINANCE
COMMISSION (PFC): LOCAL GOVERNMENTS' BUDGET 2019-20.**

11th meeting of Provincial Finance Commission was held on **21st May, 2019 at 02:00 PM** under the chairmanship of Minister for Finance, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. List of the participants is exhibited at **Annex-I**.

2. After the customary rituals, the meeting formally started with the brief of Secretary Finance on the PFC in general and the agenda items in particular.

3. Agenda comprised the following items:

- i. **Determination of allocable share(s) of resources (salary, non-salary, grant to local councils & development) to be transferred to local governments (devolved departments) for the next financial year 2019-20.**
- ii. **Newly created District of Upper Chitral.**
- iii. **Budget provision for leave encashment in lieu of LPR under Non-Salary for the next financial year 2019-20.**
- iv. **Budget Provisions for the district of Newly Merged Areas for next financial year 2019-20.**
- v. **Provisions for the Establishment of 25 Nos. of TMAs in New Merged Areas (Erstwhile FATA) 2019-20.**
- vi. **Provision for operational grant for the establishment of District and village/neighborhood councils in Newly Merged Areas (NMA) for 2019-20.**
- vii. **Any other item/issue with the approval of the Chairman.**





4. After having thorough discussion/deliberation, the Commission agreed to make the following decisions/recommendations:-

ITEM NO.1: Determination of allocable share(s) of resources (salary, non-salary, grant to local councils & development) to be transferred to local governments (devolved departments) for the next financial year 2019-20.

The Commission recommended the following increase in respect of Salary, Non-Salary, and Grant to Local Councils with certain percentage(s)/yardsticks etc as under:

(A) Salary:

- (i) 5% annual incremental increase over revised estimates 2018-19.
- (ii) Block allocation/provision of **Rs. 9,500.000 million** as a budgetary cover.

(B) Non-Salary:

- (i) **10%** increase over the current year's (2018-19) allocations.
- (ii) Block allocation/provision of **Rs. 7,620.930 million**. The commission however, agreed to expand the scope of conditional Grant for emergency medicines in BHUs (**Rs. 1000.000 million**) to all the devolved health facilities/hospitals under the administrative control of DHOs concerned.

(C) Grant to Local Councils

1) Grant to TMAs/Towns

- (i) **05%** increase over current year (2018-19) grant to TMAs.



(ii) Block allocation/provision of **Rs. 500.000 million** for financially weak/newly created TMAs on need basis.

(iii) **The historic share/collection of grant to those Cantonment Boards (CBs) having share-arrangements with adjacent TMAs shall continue to be transferred directly as usual.** However, the commission recommended **05%** increase over the current year's allocation to CBs.

2) Grant to District Councils/VCs & NCs

(i) **05%** increase over the current year's allocations.

(ii) **District Government** shall retain **20% share** of the Grant to meet salary/operational expenses of the staff of District Council Secretariat and charges on account of honoraria, allowances and other perks and privileges of the elected official(s) of the District Council while the remaining **80%** thereof shall be transferred to **VCs/NCs** for meeting out requirements on account of honoraria, allowances and perks & privileges of their elected officials as well as other operational expenses.

(D) District Development Share:

(i) As per Section 53 of LGA, 2013 the Development Grant for Local Govt. shall not be less than **30%** of the total development budget of the province in respective year.





- (ii) Similarly, according to the proviso to Clause (a) of Section-2 of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Local Government (Amendment) Act, 2017 the Government may allocate certain amount from the thirty per cent (**30%**) grant to a **public interest fund** to be administered by Government and to be used by public functionaries for the development of local governments.
- (iii) Determination of District Development Budget by the Government is nevertheless, subject to finalization/announcement of Federal Budget and communication of its receivable estimated resources to the Provincial Government.
- (iv) The commission nonetheless, tentatively recommended **Rs. 36,500.000 million** as District ADP under Budget Strategy paper-II (BSP-II).
- (v) However, the distribution of development fund in respect of district tier shall be made in accordance with new district-wise data for determination of development share of funds according to the factors i.e. Population, Poverty and lag in infrastructure in the light of Census 2017 received from Planning & Development department. However, the distribution of development fund amongst TMAs and VCs/NCs shall be made on the basis of population.





ITEM NO.2:

Newly created District of Upper Chitral.

- (i) **05%** increase over the revised size of **Salary** component.
- (ii) **10%** increase over **Non-Salary**.
- (iii) **05%** increase over **Grant to Local Councils**.
- (iv) Additional allocation/provision of **Rs. 20.000 million** under **Non-Salary** component.

ITEM NO.3:

Budget provision for leave encashment in lieu of LPR under Non-Salary for the next financial year 2019-20

- (i) The commission in line with the decision of CGA Islamabad agreed to shift the budgetary allocation for object code 'leave encashment in lieu of LPR' from salary component & create it under non-salary component.
- (ii) In this regard, the commission recommended **Rs. 2811.000 million** (worked out on the basis of actuals of last financial year) under non-salary component as a budgetary cover.

ITEM NO.4:

Budget Provisions for the district of Newly Merged Areas for next financial year 2019-20

- (i) **5%** increase over the existing/current allocation of **Salary** component in r/o devolved functions/departments of NMAs.
- (ii) **10%** increase over the current year's allocations 2018-19 under **Non-Salary** of devolved departments of NMAs.
- (iii) The commission was further pleased to recommend the provision of Block allocation of **Rs. 4000.000 million as District Development Fund** under development component for NMAs.



ITEM NO.5:

Provisions for the Establishment of 25 Nos. of TMAs in New Merged Areas (Erstwhile FATA) 2019-20.

(i) The commission in line with the approval of Chief Minister on the summary of Local Govt. Department recommended **Rs. 542.617 million** as **one time operational grant** for the establishment of **25 TMAs** in **NMAs** during the next financial year 2019-20.

ITEM NO.6:

Provision for operational grant for the establishment of District and village/neighborhood councils in Newly Merged Areas (NMA) for 2019-20.

(i) In this regard, the commission recommended **Rs. 175.000 million (Rs. 25.000 million each per unit/district)** on the analogy of corresponding size of sums allocated for areas of settled districts like Battagram, Upper Dir, Tank & Shangla etc. The commission nevertheless, recommended creation of required number of posts in the VCs/NCs etc to be established in the wake of ongoing changes in Local Govt. System without providing any cash cover therefor at least for the time being.

ITEM NO.7:

Any other Item with permission of the Chair.

The commission during the course of deliberations felt the need for thorough discussion on issues like improving distribution mechanism/formula, taxation issues with cantonment boards & rationalization of conditional grant/block allocation under Education & Health Sectors etc. in the future meetings.

No. PO(LG)2-45/District APP/2016-17: The Government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa is pleased to devise the following guidelines under Section 53 of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Local Government Act 2013 (Amended Act 2017) for implementation of developmental schemes under certain share of 30% grant allocated to public interest fund to be administered by Government used by public functionaries for the development of Local Government:-

- i. The Finance Department will retain certain amount (2% for Chief Minister and 1% for Senior Minister, Finance Department Khyber Pakhtunkhwa respectively) out of 30% developmental budget to be used by the public functionaries for the development of Local Governments;
- ii. The Chief Minister and Senior Minister, Finance Department will issue directive for the developmental schemes in respect of these funds;
- iii. The PC-I of said directive will be prepared by the concerned executing agency and will be discussed/ approved in DDC of concerned district;
- iv. Administrative Approval will be issued accordingly;
- v. On the basis of approved scheme the Finance Department will release funds directly to the Account-IV of concerned district;
- vi. Deputy Commissioner will be the Principal Accounting Officer of the said funds and submit progress report to Local Government Department accordingly.

2. The Guidelines may be followed in letter and spirit.


